Practical Information

1. TRAINING SCHOOL VENUE

The Training School will be held in the Faculty of Economics and Business Sciences, University of Seville.

The address is Avda. Ramón y Cajal 1, 41018 Sevilla.

2. HOW TO REACH THE VENUE

From the Airport to the Residence (Rector Estanislao del Campo)

Take the bus line 'EA' to Seville and stop in Prado San Sebastián (Carlos V) station. Then,





change a bus at Avenida Carlos V, take a line 37 (Bellavista) until Guadalbullon. From there, the Residence is a 1min walk. In total, this route is around 50min.

From the Santa Justa train station to the Residence (Rector Estanislao del Campo)

In the case you go to the Residence first, your best option would be a taxi but you can also take a train probably the best option would be to take a train, C5 line (cercanias) from Santa Justa station two stops to Seville-Virgen del Rocío. From there, you could walk 10 minutes to the Residence. Considering the temperature, we would recommend taking a cab which you can find right when you come out of the station, at an official taxi stop with a long line of people standing and waiting for their taxi.

From the Airport to Faculty of Economics and Business Sciences

Take the bus line 'EA' to Seville and stop in San Bernardo Train Station ("Apeadero de San Bernardo".

From Santa Justa Train Station to Faculty of Economics and Business Sciences

Take the bus line 'C1' in 'José Laguillo Avenue' direction 'Prado de San Sebastián' and stop in 'San Bernardo' or take de train (line C1) from Santa Justa to San Bernardo train station.

5. HIGH TEMPERATURES

Seville in the summer months can reach high temperatures, particularly if there is a heat wave. Here — are some tips based on common sense that you can apply in case you are not used to this kind of temperatures:

- It is important when you go out to wear a hat and to walk in shadow as possible.
- If you are very sensitive to solar radiation, better to wear solar cream on your face, arms and legs.
- The best hours to go for a walk are before 11 am and after 8 or 9 pm. The sunset is around 10 pm.
- Drink water, slowly (all the time) even if you don't feel thirsty.
- Draw the blinds in the buildings/rooms where you are.
- Use a fan (the word in Spanish is "abanico").
- Use vaporisers with cool water (we'll have some at the Training School that you can use).
- Take cool showers and dress in light and loose clothing made from natural fabrics
- Most buildings are air-conditioned buildings but remember that being indoor with temperatures below 21 degrees and then going outside may not be too sharp of a contrast.
